














Core Value #3: Financial Stewardship

MEET ROBIN CORLEY

If you haven't met Robin Corley, you are missing out! Her vibrant spirit and health journey are the perfect fit to express why LVIM is so important to working, uninsured residents of Polk County.

Robin came to LVIM almost 7 years ago with a single complaint of chronic fatigue. She says, 'Walmart offers health insurance, but there is no way I could afford it, even working full-time." When she came in she really didn't know what to expect, but she was pleasantly surprised by the welcome and care she received. "I have never seen a free clinic that treats people so good." She got her initial bloodwork, as all new patients get, and was diagnosed with Hypothyroidism.



She was immediately placed on Levothyroxine and has been on this medication since her diagnosis. She also had some pre-existing and chronic conditions to include depression, anxiety, herniated disc and she is completely blind in her right eye. She is very thankful that her LVIM providers have paid close attention to these conditions and made sure that she gets the proper referrals, medications and follow-up care that she deserves. She is very passionate when she says, "I always feel like they treat me like a person."

Over the years, Robin has had an array of medical conditions arise, some of which include increased blood sugars, high blood pressure and cholesterol, but she has never let them alter her delightful personality or her thankfulness of what LVIM has done and is doing for her. In 2020, Robin was prescribed 21 different medications for acute and chronic health issues. In 2021, she was down to 15. In 2022 there were only 8 and starting off in 2023, she is on only 3 medications, which include Tolterodine, Diclofenac and Oxybutynin and she gets a B12 shot. She attributes these results to the primary care made available to her at LVIM and her personal goals to stay healthy. She has a current goal to lose 94 lbs, 27 of which she has already lost. She says cheerfully, "only 67 more!" What a testament this is to her personal commitment to her health and happiness.

Robin is a full-time employee of Walmart and she 'loves her job!' She says, 'the relationships I have with my customers warms my heart and keeps me going.' Speaking of her heart, Robin is having some issues with her heart and just this week received a heart monitor from LVIM so that her provider, Emma McMicken, APRN, can monitor her and figure out what is going on. She has been scheduled to see LVIM's cardiologist too. She is so thankful for the quick attention that she has received to keep her on track to her health goals.

Stories like Robin's are exactly why LVIM is such a needed resource for our community and is the true definition of 'filling the gap' between those who cannot afford health care coverage and those that do not qualify for other health care options, like Medicaid. Robin is a strong voice for LVIM and its mission, has referred many of her friends and co-workers and has a strong belief that what LVIM is doing can benefit so many more Polk County residents.

MOBILE FOOD PANTRY






